If you are biblically dealing with the idols of your sin nature and yielding to the Divine Nature during stressful times, you can help others. (Romans 15:14; Galatians 5:16 - 6:3)

Course Description

A biblical approach to help individuals, families, and churches counsel and assist people in crisis, to analyze the reason for the crisis, to use Scripture, examples of Bible characters and responses of Christ in order to evangelize lost people in crisis and to equip saints to have renewal and a godly response to crisis.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this course, you should be able to:

- 1. Study the Bible more contextually and hermeneutically for application in biblical counseling.
- 2. Gain more confidence in the Bible and the power of the Holy Spirit to meet all spiritual needs in counseling.
- 3. Learn to identify root problems of symptom sins for the purpose of progressive sanctification and long-term change.
- 4. Help people to become more Christlike through suffering, trials, and trauma.
- 5. Comprehend why secular psychology's view of the non-spiritual nature of man and evolution does not help people to change and grow. Unbiblical counseling models, labels, terminology, pharmaceutical treatments, man-centered/humanistic therapy, view of the brain and mind, and replacement of the Bible with DSM manuals are some of their false beliefs, methods, and practices.
- 6. Help counselees respond to crisis as modeled by Christ's earthly life.
- 7. Learn the biblical process of victory over a life-dominating sin habit and learn to teach abused or traumatized individuals biblical refocusing and renewing of the whole person.
- 8. Help families solve marital and teenage problems and respond biblically to divorce.
- 9. Guide those facing death or the death of a family member.
- 10. Give homosexuals Bible hope and God's way out of idolatry.
- 11. Have a Scriptural approach to demonized people, a growing problem that pastors, missionaries and churches will not be able to ignore.
- 12. Teach people in crisis to glorify God and to exalt His Son by the Scripture and the Spirit and to identify the major missing dynamic in biblical counseling in North America.

Reading and Listening

On the first day of class, you must submit the hard-copy form stating you have completed all reading and listening assignments. As specified below, you must also submit at the same time ten hard-copy forms with your take-aways on the ten *Help!* booklets, five hard-copy forms on the CoRE Conference sessions, one hard-copy form with a three-paragraph biblical counseling philosophy, and one hard-copy form with your definition of the word *crisis.* These forms will be graded and returned to you on the final day of class.
