Full Review of Business Processes In 2023, we reworked every asp of our business processes, from

In 2023, we reworked every aspect

marketing to new student registration to financial reporting.

- We replaced several time-intensive processes with software or automation.
- We are able to get additional help through Upwork—a virtual assistant marketplace connecting us to Filipinos with administrative skills at a cost of \$7 / hour.

As a result, we were able to cut our expenses by \$30,000 / year. This opens new and better ways to use those funds that directly benefit our students.

Full Reworking of Our Programs We also fully reworked the degrees we offer.

Previously we offered a "one year" and "four year program." This was because we were uncertain of our legal right to offer formal academic degrees in the province of Alberta. In Fall of 2023 we spoke with the ministry of Advanced Education and confirmed that we can offer the following degree programs.

We have also reviewed and restructured our catalog of classes so that future students will enjoy a tightly designed program focused on the skills and opportunities they need for ministry.

Our programs include for the first time general education courses, significantly raising the academic value we can offer. We have been able to design these courses with realworld ministry in mind.




Growing Student Population We were seeing the beginnings of new momentum in student population just


before 2019 and Covid. Now that has fully recovered and increased.


But the most important metric is students taking classes for credit; this often also an represents a higher level of engagement and intentions to pursue a degree program.

- (1) Men interested in graduate studies pursuant to a ministerial degree.
- (2) Younger, college-aged students pursuing a certificate or bachelor degree.








Where are we going?

We believe there is much more that can be done in the near future. Our current limitation is not ideas or opportunities; it is the time to keep up with all that we could be doing. But that means we have plenty of runway for growth and improvement.

biblical foundation for their future education or the trades. But first, it will be important that this work is backed by accreditation.



Advanced Placement for Another growing opportunity is for grades 10-

Homeschoolers 12 to take several courses to fulfill their highschool credits. They can take these classes

online and graduate from high school having achieved as many as 20 college credits.

Once again, this option will be much more appealing if the classes are accredited and transferrable.

Graduate-level Foundation's mission is that we exist to strengthen members of local churches and train future pastors. We began offering graduate level courses for the first time this

year and the response was immediate and strong. And we continue to receive interest from prospects.

This is both an exciting opportunity and one of the highest value investments we could make—training pastors. But once again, the value of these graduate degrees is dependent on accreditation.



Why Accreditation?


On January 25 we received a preliminary site visit from Shane Woods of the Association of Biblical Higher Education. We had already submitted an extensive document and Shane talked with us about every part of our organization. The conclusion of this meeting was that the goal is achievable for us with a few barriers we must overcome. The most significant obstacle is financial.





On February 8, Joel Arnold presented this information to the Foundation Board. They unanimously voted to pursue accreditation and initiate a fund-raising effort to make the process financially achievable.

The Process Accreditation is a rigorous review of every aspect and process of a college to ensure that policies are clear, consistently applied, and for the students' best interests. Accreditation requires colleges holding other colleges accountable to pursue excellence. The result is a higher confidence for students or sister institutions. Accreditation is an independently verified seal of excellence.



Like anything worth doing, the process is long. And yet many of the benefits begin to accrue as soon as the college enters the process.

Why Pursue Accreditation?

Something this costly in time and human effort must have a high proven value. We believe that several reason merit this cost:



Tranferability: Accreditation allows our student to transfer credits or continue their studies at other institutions. As one administrator told us, "just knowing that you are talking with ABHE gives me more confidence about a partnership."



Student Confidence: One of the most common questions we hear from prospective students is whether we are accredited. This is a fair question because it gives them confidence that they can continue to graduate school or use their credits elsewhere.



Access to Grants and Student Loans: The post-secondary education industry runs on government grants and student loans. Without accreditation, none of this is available to our students.



Greater Value: To this point, our tuition costs are a mere fraction of sister institutions. But this is also only fair because we cannot offer equivalent value if we are unaccredited. Entering this process will raise the value of our product and allow us to merit asking tuition costs more in line with the rest of the market.



Continuous Improvement: The most basic reason for accreditation is that it will force us to improve. This is not a process for its own sake. We are already reaping tangible benefits for our students, just because of the process of getting ready to apply!

In short, we believe that we will be permanently limited as an institution apart from accreditation. We will function more as a Bible institute and lack serious appeal to degree-pursuant college students unless we do the hard work of pursuing accreditation to improve our product.

The Cost

One concern is to insure that we have the financial stability to complete this project before beginning it. We are now financially solvent and saving money, but without adequate funding to cover these costs. We are confident that once accreditation begins we will be able to increasingly shoulder and sustain these costs through increased student tuition.

But in the short term we need a hand up to get us over this barrier. Our board is seeking to raise at least \$50,000 before beginning the process and ultimately we need to pursue a total of \$100,000 that will bring us solidly past the mid-way mark of the process.

Our Fund-Raising Plan


We plan to seek for matching commitments of at least \$25,000. We would then complete fund-raising from local churches, students, and other smaller fund-raising efforts. A group of our students, faculty, and board members plan to organize a walk-a-thon fund-raiser this summer.

Our constituency is already growing, and we believe that they will share our vision to pursue accreditation along with the associated costs.

What until then?

While we wait for the needed funding, we are already positioning ourselves to be ready.

- We have contacted The Alberta Library, EBSCO and several sister institutions to find out how to improve our library holdings. This will enhance what is available to our students.
- We have reached out to contacts in the accreditation world and gathered advice about how to proceed.
- One of the major projects of year 1 is to build learning objectives and assessments for every course in our program. Though schools normally begin this once inside the process, we have already completed this project so that much of the work for our first year of accreditation is already done. You can see our progess on year one accreditation objectives below.
